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
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
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
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EDITOR'S LETTER

Game On

n the run-up to Detroit 500, this year, we asked honorees what future events the city and region should bid for based on the record-setting NFL Draft, which drew more than 775,000 fans to downtown Detroit from April 25-27.

Among the questions we asked, the prospect of adding future events was the most popular. The responses included everything from hosting another Super Bowl to adding men's and women's NCAA regional and championship games, a World Cup, a Formula 1 repeat, major tennis matches, the Summer Olympics, and more.

"Detroit has proven its capability to successfully host national and international events, often breaking records in the process," said Cindy Pasky, founder and CEO of Strategic Staffing Solutions in Detroit.

"It's time to bring the Super Bowl back to Detroit, along with other major sporting events like the Final Four. Additionally, we should see more shared festivals with Windsor, Ontario. Our unique location allows our two cities to collaborate on international events, enhancing the experience for all."

Quite a few responses mentioned hosting a Summer Olympics in partnership with Windsor.

If the global competition was hosted on both sides of the border, it would be the first Olympic Games to be held in two different countries. For a Detroit-Windsor bid, the costs could be shared, and multiple venues in each city and region would meet the criteria of the International Olympic Committee.

Other major events cited in the responses reflect our ethnic heritage, given nearly every nationality in the world has some sort of presence here due to the auto industry.

"The city should focus on bidding for events that highlight its strengths and appeal to diverse audiences," said Gordon Follmer, managing director of UHY Advisors Inc. in Farmington Hills. "Hosting NBA and NHL All-Star Games would bring sports enthusiasts to the city and showcase Detroit's vibrant sports culture.

"Targeting major tech conferences would attract professionals and entrepreneurs from around the globe - advancing the region as an innovation hub. Expanding on events like the Movement Electronic Music Festival and Afro

Nation to include globally recognized music festivals would complement the city's rich culture."

Tarek Sobh, president of Lawrence Technological University in Southfield, offered a compelling list of potential opportunities: The U.S. Figure Skating Championships and the Ryder Cup (it would be the second time for both), the X Games, rowing and sailing regattas, Red Bull Extreme Sporting Events, more Thunder Boat races, Pro Motocross and others

Honorees from around the state also saw Detroit's potential to host a variety of new activities.

"I come from a family of artists, including musicians," said Andi Owen, president and CEO of MillerKnoll in Zeeland. "Detroit has a rich musical history. The city was the birthplace of Motown, the blues, jazz - even early punk rock. We've turned out music icons like the Temptations, Diana Ross, and Eminem, and that passion and talent is just as palpable today as it has been since the beginning.

"Just look at the Detroit Jazz Festival, and the venues and lounges across the city that hold up the music scene to this day. I would love to see that history amplified even further with bids on major music festivals or other art-form events, both to draw attention to Detroit's incredible place in music history (and to) create new community partnerships and engagement with local artists."

Put another way, it's game on.
